Vanity Call Fee Increase Proposed

The FCC proposed March 26 increasing the regulatory fee to apply for, renew or reinstate an Amateur radio vanity call sign from \$14.50 to \$16.30 this fall. The FCC NPRM also seeks comments on its efforts to review, streamline and modernize its fee assessment and collection processes and procedures.

Interested parties may comment via the FCC's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) at www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs. Enter "MD 03-83" in the "Proceeding" field. Electronic comments by e-mail also are welcome.
